Bernardino Gomes studied political science at the University of Louvain, Belgium; He was Head of Policy Planning staff at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and served as chief of staff to Mario Soares, former Prime Minister and two-term President of Portugal. He was Member of the Board of Directors of the Luso-American Foundation (FLAD) and Advisor at the Institute for National Defense, among other duties. He is presently a researcher at the Portuguese Institute for International Relations (IPRI), a think tank.

Tiago Moreira de Sá has his Ph.D in Modern and Contemporary History from ISCTE-Lisbon University Institute, is a Guest Assistant Professor, Faculty of Social and Human Sciences - New University of Lisbon; and is a researcher at the Portuguese Institute for International Relations (IPRI) at the New University of Lisbon. He is the author of *Os Americanos na Revolução Portuguesa* [The Americans in the Portuguese Revolution] and *Os Estados Unidos e a Descolonização de Angola* (The United States and the Angolan decolonization), as well as of several peer-reviewed journal articles.
